



Erin Chupka is a nationally recognized advocate for youth empowerment. Her passion for helping young people has been at the center of her two decades of leadership. Recently elevated to Executive Director of Girls Inc. of Metropolitan Dallas, Erin had spent the previous eight years as Vice President of Program Services where she led a 300 percent increase in youth served, a 628 percent increase in school partners, and a 125 percent growth in grant revenue. Erin has developed innovative delivery models to drive strategic growth, including the Power 2 The Girl conference, workforce development programs, pop-up camps and workshops.

Erin's diverse expertise in programs, fundraising, finance and operations, enables her to build high-performing teams, drive operational excellence and scale impact. In response to the 2020 Covid pandemic, Erin and her team quickly pivoted to virtual programming, which allowed the organization and the girls to not only continue their high-quality programming, but to grow year over year by more than 50 percent. When Girls Inc. returned to inperson programming the growth continued and they now serve more than 4,500 girls in 31 zip codes across Dallas.

Thanks to Erin's leadership and innovation, Girls Inc. of Metropolitan Dallas received the Large Affiliate of the Year Award from Girls Inc. National Organization, as well as the Dallas Business Journal's Leaders in Diversity Award. Erin serves on the Dallas Regional Chamber's Education & Workforce Council and is engaged with Girls Inc. on the national level, serving on various task forces and committees.
